Stained glass windows

Highcliffe Castle is famous for its big stained glass window in our Great Hall. It's full of bright colours and intricate patterns.

Create your own stained glass window to display at home.



What you will need:

- Our window template (printed on thin card if possible)
- Washable kids paint
- Wax paper or thin grease-proof paper
- Large bottle lid and/or paintbrush
- Glue

How to make a stained glass window:

- Cut a sheet of wax or grease-proof paper slightly bigger than the window template
- Add a generous amount of paint onto the bottle top or paintbrush, then dab-and-twist it on the paper.

- Keep dabbing and twisting paint of different colours all over the paper until it is covered. Make sure that you wipe the lid regularly to stop the paint becoming too 'muddy' in colour
- Wait for the paint to dry

- Cut out the window template so that you just have the black outlines
- Glue the window template in place on top of the painted wax paper
- Trim the excess wax paper
- Place in front of a sunny window to admire your work
